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ACT OF INCORPORATION.

Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTEEN.

AN ACT TO INCORPORATE THE

Handel and Haydn Society.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, That* THOMAS SMITH WEBB, AMASA WINCHESTER, NATHANIEL TUCKER, and MATTHEW STANLEY PARKER, together with such as may become associated with them, and their successors, be, and they hereby are incorporated and made a body politic and corporation for the purpose of extending

the knowledge and improving the style of performance of Church Music, by the name of the **HANDEL AND HAYDN SOCIETY**, and by that name they may sue and be sued, have a common seal, and the same at pleasure alter, and be entitled to all the powers and privileges incident to aggregate Corporations.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted*, That the said Corporation shall at their first, or some subsequent meeting, choose a President, Treasurer, and such other officers as they may deem necessary or convenient for the government and regulation of said Corporation and its property. They shall have the power to make standing rules or bye-laws, for prescribing the terms of office, and duties of their officers, for regulating the terms on which persons may be admitted and continue members of the Corporation, and generally for the regulation of their affairs.

SECT. 3. *Be it further enacted*, That the said Corporation shall be capable of taking and holding real estate, not exceeding the value of fifty thousand dollars, and personal estate, not exceeding the value of fifty thousand dollars, which estate shall never be di-

vided among the members of the Corporation, but shall descend to their successors, subject only to the payment of the just debts to be incurred by said Corporation.

SECT. 4. *Be it further enacted*, That THOMAS SMITH WEBB shall have power to call the first meeting of said Corporation by appointing a time and place therefor, and giving notice thereof to the other persons named and incorporated by this act.

BYE-LAWS
OF THE
HANDEL & HAYDN SOCIETY.

INCORPORATED FEB. 9, 1816.

ART. 1. The officers of this institution shall consist of a President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Secretary, and nine Trustees. These shall constitute a Board of Management denominated "The Board of Trustees of the Handel and Haydn Society."

ART. 2. There shall be an annual meeting of the Society, for the choice of officers and for the transaction of business, on the first Monday of September.—The election of officers shall be by ballot, and a majority of a quorum shall be necessary to a choice. But no person shall serve as a Trustee for more than three years in succession. In case the Society from any unavoidable cause should fail to choose all or either of its officers on the aforesaid evening, then they (the said Society) shall have power to adjourn from

time to time until such election is completed; provided, however, that not more than ten days shall intervene from one adjournment to another.

ART. 3. Thirty members shall constitute a quorum of the Society, and be competent to the transaction of business.

ART. 4. The President shall preside at all meetings of the Society and of the Board of Trustees. In all meetings for the performance of music, he shall assign the parts to the performers, direct the time and style of performance; and shall be exclusively the conductor of all Oratorios or Concerts given by the Society. In the discharge of his duties, he may employ such aid as he may deem necessary and proper.

ART. 5. In the absence of the President, the Vice President shall perform his duties; and in the absence of both these officers, the Trustees, according to priority of choice, shall succeed to the same duties.

ART. 6. The Board of Trustees shall superintend the prudential concerns of the Society; they shall have power to judge of the qualifications of candidates; to select pieces

of music for performance ; to provide suitable buildings and all other accommodations for the Society ; to remit the admission fees, or any arrearages due by members, when in their opinion the circumstances of such members require it, or the best interests of the Society will be promoted thereby ; and generally to transact, manage, and direct every thing, which the interests of the Society may in their judgment, require, which is not especially provided for in these articles. It shall be their duty to assemble together as often as occasion may require, and the necessary expenses incurred at such meetings shall be defrayed from the funds of the Society. It shall be their duty at least one month previous to the annual meeting, to appoint a Committee (a majority of which shall not be members of the Board) to examine the Secretary's and Treasurer's accounts; and a statement of these accounts, together with a report of the proceedings of the Board, generally, shall be made at the annual meeting.—Seven members of the Board shall constitute a quorum for business.

ART. 7. The Secretary shall keep a record of the proceedings of the Society and of the

Board of Trustees ; give all necessary notice of meetings ; receive all monies, and pay the same over to the Treasurer.

ART. 8. The Treasurer shall take charge of the Society's funds ; and whenever thereunto required, shall render an account to the Board of Trustees of all monies received, and of the state of the Treasury. He shall not pay any money from the Treasury but by a resolution of the Board of Trustees to the order of the President : He shall give bonds for the faithful discharge of the duties of his office when required thereto by the Board of Trustees.

ART. 9. The right to assess, or tax the members of the Society for any purpose whatever, shall rest exclusively with the Society itself : and the Board of Trustees shall in no case exercise this power, unless authorised so to do by a special resolution of the Society.

ART. 10. In order that the portion of the public, who are lovers of sacred Music, may have opportunities of participating in the enjoyment contemplated by the members of this Society, there may be performed, occasional-

ly, Oratorios or Concerts of sacred Music, whenever the government of the Society shall think proper ; at which persons may be admitted by tickets, to be sold for that purpose : and the monies arising from the sale of said tickets, shall be appropriated to the payment of the expenses of the society ; the remuneration of professional musicians ; the procurement of a musical library, musical instruments, and all such other conveniences and accommodations as may be deemed necessary and proper for the Society by the Board of Trustees. But no one, who is a member of the Society, shall be entitled to claim any compensation for personal services rendered to the Society, in the performance of music, either on private or public occasions.

ART. 11. The stated meetings of the Society, for the practice of music, shall be holden on the first Tuesday evening in every month, at such place and hour as may from time to time be appointed ; and the President shall call extra meetings for the same purpose, when in his judgment, they may be necessary ; and also when thereunto requested by any ten members. The President shall also

be empowered to call special meetings of the Society for the practice of music, at which the roll of the Society shall be called : Provided, however, that notice of the special meetings shall always be given at a previous meeting, and shall also be advertised, as such, in three or more of the public papers.

ART. 12. On the application of five or more members of the Society, extra meetings for business may be called at the discretion of the Board of Trustees: Provided, however, that at least seven days' notice of such meetings, stating their specific object, shall always be given in three or more of the public papers.

ART. 13. No person shall be admitted a member of this Society, unless proposed and recommended by the Board of Trustees, at a previous meeting of the Society, nor without the consent of seven-eighths of the members present when ballotted for. Provided, also, that an admission fee of ten dollars shall be required of every new member admitted, to be paid on signing the Bye-Laws. Members may be admitted at any meeting of the Society.

ART. 14. Two thirds of the members shall be competent to expel any member who shall be guilty of a breach of the Bye-laws of the Society, or of any misconduct, or disorderly behaviour at any of its meetings.

ART. 15. No debate or discussion of any question shall be allowed at any meeting of the Society which has been called for the practice of music.

ART. 16. Any member desirous of withdrawing from the Society, shall make known his desire in writing to the Board of Trustees, and they shall grant his request, provided he shall first discharge and pay all debts that may be due from him to the Society.

ART. 17. Any member refusing or neglecting to pay monies that may be due from him to the Society, for the space of three months, shall, at the discretion of the Board of Trustees, forfeit his membership; but shall nevertheless be liable to pay all such arrears as may then be due and owing by him to the Society: Provided, however, that no forfeiture of membership shall take place under the 17th, 18th, or 19th articles without the concurrence of a majority of the whole Board.

ART. 18. Any member refusing or neglecting to take his proper situation in the Orchestra, when requested thereto by the President, or any Committee appointed for the purpose, shall, at the discretion of the Board of Trustees, forfeit his membership.

ART. 19. Any member who shall absent himself from two special meetings in succession, and on being notified of his delinquency by the Secretary, fails to offer a satisfactory excuse to the Board of Trustees, within twenty days from said notice, shall forfeit his membership.

ART. 20. Any member having forfeited his membership under either of the foregoing articles, shall be notified of the same within ten days, by the Secretary, in writing.

ART. 21. Any member of the Board of Trustees who shall be absent from three successive meetings of the Board, shall be notified of his neglect by the Secretary, and unless a satisfactory excuse shall be rendered in writing to the Board, at its next ensuing meeting, the Board may report the name of such delinquent to the Society at its next meeting; and the Society may then declare his seat at

the Board vacated ; and proceed to the choice of a new member to supply the vacancy.

Art. 22. To perpetuate this Society and extend its benefits, at least three-fourths of all the profits arising or accruing to the Society from the publication and sale of music, shall go to constitute a fund; two thirds of which, shall be reserved and appropriated to the building a Hall for the use of the Society, and the remaining third shall be appropriated to the purchase of a musical Library, or any other object consistent with the original design of this Institution as expressed in the charter ; under the direction of the Board of Trustees.

ART. 23. The Board of Trustees may, at their discretion, admit as honorary members of the Society, such gentlemen as are distinguished for their love of music, or their zeal for the promotion of the great objects of this institution : but no honorary member can be entitled to a vote, nor be liable to any assessment, but shall be entitled to all other rights and privileges that other members of the Society are entitled to.

ART. 24. Any alteration or addition to these articles that may hereafter be assented to by two thirds of the members present at any legal meeting for business, shall become obligatory and binding upon the whole Society. But no alteration or amendment shall be adopted, unless the same shall be first proposed in writing to the Board of Trustees, and by them submitted to the Society for its acceptance. Provided, also, that at least seven days notice of any intended alteration or addition shall be given in one or more of the public papers.
